 - Using these Guiding Notes, you will be **required** to write an essay in Language Arts class when school begins in September. (Don't lose these!)
 - You may print out this page or copy down the questions on your own paper.
 - Including page numbers is imperative as you will need to refer back to the book when you write the essay in September.
 - You may take the AR test for the book that you read, but you will not be required to do so.

1. Where and when does the story take place? Be as specific as possible and include examples and page numbers that provide details.
 2. Who is the main character? What qualities does this character possess? Include examples and page numbers.
 3. List three reasons why you would or would not recommend this book. Include specific examples and page numbers.
